

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Dear Potential Medicaid and BadgerCare HMO Enrollee

Most families participating in Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare receive their health care through HMOs (Health Maintenance Organizations). This booklet will help you choose an HMO for your family. You must choose the same HMO for all eligible family members.


Not all HMOs in this book are available to you. Your HMO Enrollment Choice form lists the HMOs you may choose from, except that HMOs marked "full" do not have room for new members.

The Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare HMO Enrollment Specialist is available toll free at (800) 291-2002 from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday to answer your questions about HMO enrollment. The Enrollment Specialist provides language translations for those who need it.

The Enrollment Specialist can tell you if your doctor accepts any of the Medicaid and BadgerCare HMOs. The Enrollment Specialist can also enroll you into the HMO of your choice right over the telephone or they can help you complete the form.

Thank you for choosing your Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare HMO!

This is a Wisconsin **Forward** card. This card is issued to individuals eligible for Medicaid and BadgerCare coverage. One of the many benefits of the Medicaid program is the opportunity to enroll into a Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare Health Maintenance Organization (HMO).



Enrollment in an HMO

Families with children who receive their health care through the Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare program are enrolled in an HMO.

Most families must enroll in an HMO. Where there are two or more HMOs available to you and your family, you will have a choice of which HMO to enroll in.

Benefits of the HMO

A primary care provider or primary care clinic of your choice will help you manage your and/or your family's health care needs.

HMO members do not have co-payments for services covered by the HMO. HMOs provide health care 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Some HMOs provide all your health care in one location.

How do you choose your HMO?

Your health care providers may include your:

- Primary care doctor,
- Specialty doctor,
- Mental health,
- Hospital, and
- Pharmacy.

The HMO your health care providers accept could be the one for you! Your health care providers may not all belong to one HMO. You then need to decide which provider is most important to you.

Other things to consider are:

- What hours are the doctors, clinics, and other providers open that belong to that HMO?
- Do any of them have evening hours?
- Do you have other health insurance? You will be expected to see health care providers who accept other insurance as well as your HMO.

Need help? Call the Enrollment Specialist at (800) 291-2002! The Enrollment Specialist can:

- Find out if your doctor, hospital, or clinic belongs to an HMO, and if so, which one.
- Help you select an HMO over the telephone or help you fill out an HMO Enrollment Choice form that you can mail.
- Answer your questions about how the HMO works.

Services HMOs Cover

HMOs cover medically necessary Medicaid covered services.

After you have joined an HMO, call the HMO to find out where to go for your health care.

The services your HMO will cover include:

- Doctor visits and hospital care
- Eye care, including eye glasses
- Outpatient and emergency care
- Drugs
- Prenatal care
- Medical equipment
- Mental health services
- Hearing services, including hearing aids.
- Family planning services and supplies
- Personal care services
- Physical and occupational therapy
- Dental care in certain counties
- Substance abuse (alcohol and other drug abuse) services.

How to Enroll in the HMO

- You can fill out, sign, and mail the Enrollment Choice Form found in this packet.
- You can call the **Enrollment Specialist at (800) 291-2002** to give your choice of HMO over the telephone.
- You can meet with the Enrollment Specialist face-to-face. Call (800) 291-2002 for details.

What happens after I am enrolled in the HMO?

You will get a membership packet that will tell you more. The membership packet lists the doctors, hospitals, and clinics that belong to your health plan. It will also explain the services your HMO provides.

Once you are enrolled in an HMO, call the HMO to:

- Find out the services your HMO provides.
- Find out the doctors and clinics you can use.
- Pick or change you and/or your family's primary care provider.







If you are not satisfied with the services, doctors, hospitals, or clinics provided by your HMO, call the **Enrollment Specialist at (800) 291-2002**. The Enrollment Specialist can help you take the next step.

What if you forget to choose an HMO?



If you do not choose an HMO (where there is more than one to choose from), one will be chosen for you. You will receive a notice in the mail telling you which HMO was chosen for you and your family. Call the **Enrollment Specialist at (800) 291-2002** right away if you want to choose a different HMO.

What if I am not happy with my HMO?

If you are not happy with the HMO you joined, you can change your HMO during the first three months of your enrollment, if one is available. This is called "open enrollment."

When your open enrollment period is over, you cannot change your HMO for nine more months. This is called a "lock-in" period. You will be sent a letter telling you when your lock-in period will end. When your lock-in period has ended, you may change to a different HMO if available.

The Enrollment Specialist can help you:

- Decide if you should change your HMO.
- Change your HMO over the telephone.
- Delay your enrollment or get permission not to join an HMO if you meet certain requirements.

You Have Rights!

As a member of an HMO in Wisconsin, you have important rights:

- You have the right to information about your HMO and how it works.
- You have the right to ask questions and to file complaints and grievances.
- You have the right to fair treatment.

Assistance for People with Disabilities

People with disabilities have the right to receive assistance. The health care providers in your HMO must assist people with disabilities. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) guarantees this right. This means the doctor's office or hospital must be easy to enter and exit.

Assistance for People Who Are Deaf or Hard of Hearing

The health care providers in your HMO must provide interpreter services for people who are deaf or hard of hearing.

Assistance for People Who Speak Different Languages

The health care providers in your HMO must provide interpreter services for people who speak different languages.

Assistance for People Who Are Blind or Visually Impaired

If you are blind or visually impaired, you can get a copy of the HMO's member handbook and other information in Braille or on audiotape.

You Have Responsibilities

To get the best health care, you have to be responsible for:

- Telling the doctors and nurses how you feel.
- Getting medical care when you need it.
- Taking your prescriptions and following the doctors' advice.
- Following the HMO's rules for getting health services.
- Keeping the appointments you make.
- Asking your doctor, HMO, or care coordinator questions.
- Telling your HMO what you think so that they can help you get the best health care.

If You Have Problems or Questions

If you have questions or problems about your doctor, your health care, or your HMO we want you to know what to do.

There are people that will help you get the health care you need. There are also many ways to solve problems and answer questions. Examples of problems and questions:

- Being refused care.
- Unable to get an appointment?
- Unable to see the doctor of your choice or a specialty doctor?
- Unable to find someone who speaks your language?
- Unhappy with the health care provider's attitude?
- Not getting help when you call the HMO's 800 number?
- Being denied medically necessary equipment or services.
- Getting a bill your HMO should pay.

If these questions or problems happen to you, you can make things better. See Who to Call for Help on the following pages.

Choosing the HMO That is Best for Your Health Care Needs

When you choose an HMO, all family members listed on your HMO Enrollment Choice form must receive health care from that HMO. It is important to choose the one HMO that is best for all family members. It is important to learn about the HMOs in your area that provide care through the Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare HMO program.

Read the materials about the HMOs carefully. Look over all the information provided. Do you know anyone who has used any of these HMOs? If so, ask them about the HMO.

Take time to answer these questions before you choose your HMO:

Health Care Providers and Clinics

- Are the primary doctors your family uses in any of these HMOs?
- Is the clinic your family goes to connected with any of these HMOs?
- Does anyone in your family go to a health care specialist who belongs to an HMO?

Hospitals and Pharmacies (Drugstores)

- Is the hospital or pharmacy your family likes to use connected with any HMO?
- Is there a hospital or pharmacy close by that is connected with an HMO?

Other Health Insurance

Do you have other health insurance? You will be expected to see health care providers who accept your other insurance as well as your HMO. The Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare HMO Enrollment Specialist can tell you how to match your HMO enrollment with your other insurance so you can use both insurance plans. Other Providers

Are there any other providers your family uses, such as dentists, eye doctors, and counselors, connected with an HMO?

Office Hours

- Does the HMO offer free health services?

Wisconsin Medicaid HMO Report Card

There are many things to think about when choosing an HMO. Which doctors, clinics, and hospitals are available? Where are they located? Which HMO performs the best in the areas of care and service that are important to you? The **HMO Report Card** can help you make this important choice. It compares one HMO to another in five areas of health care (HealthChecks, shots, and lead screens for children; pap tests for women; and mental health and substance abuse evaluations) and four areas of enrollee satisfaction (customer service, getting needed care, the health plan, and health care). 
What special services are available to me?

- Personalized and compassionate local customer service staff that speaks English, Spanish, Hmong, and German. Interpreter service is available for other languages free of charge.
- After-hours help line available 24 hours a day, seven days a week to help you with emergencies if you cannot reach your doctor.
- Newsletters and educational material filled with helpful tips and resources sent to you several times a year.
- · Vision services.
- Behavioral health and substance abuse services.
- Transportation to and from any medical or dental appointments including pharmacy visits, lab work and behavioral health services.
- Walk-in clinics (Urgent Care) hours available on weekends and evenings.
- Member Advocates on staff to help you with any needs you may have getting health care or any problems you are experiencing with our providers and services.
- Outreach services to expecting mothers including newborn baby visits.
- Abri Health Plan covers all your prescription drugs and many over-the-counter drugs including stop smoking patches.
- Abri offers the **First Breath** program which is a statewide program that provides help for pregnant women to stop smoking.
- Abri has nurses and social workers who can work with you to help you access and arrange for your health care needs and teach you how to keep yourself and your children healthy.

We can help you to choose a primary care physician (PCP) when you enroll with us. Call us at (888) 999-2404 (toll free). You can change your PCP any time. Women can choose both an OB/GYN and another PCP.

What pharmacies (drugstores) will fill my prescriptions?

You can fill your prescriptions at many pharmacies throughout the Children's Community Health Plan service area, including Aurora, Wheaton Franciscan (formerly Covenant), Kmart, Osco, Serv U, Target, Walgreens and Wal-Mart. To find out if Children's Community Health Plan will pay for specific prescriptions, ask your pharmacist or call Customer Service toll free at (800) 482-8010. Be sure to show the pharmacy your Forward card and any other insurance cards that you have.

What special services are available to me?

- Dental, vision and behavioral health services.
- You will periodically receive a Children's Community Health Plan newsletter, with useful health advice and information.
- For members who live in Milwaukee County, non-emergency transportation is available at no charge to and from any medical appointments including pharmacy visits and lab work. Members who live in other counties can contact their county caseworker for help.
- Nurse line Nurses who will assist you and your family in obtaining help or medical attention if you cannot reach your Primary Care Provider after normal business hours.
- Free classes offered through Children's Hospital and Health System, designed to help parents and caregivers improve the health of children.
- Free fittings and safety checks for car and booster seats.
- Catch Your Breath Asthma Survival Skills class offered at no charge.
- The ClearPath Program which offers a short educational program for parents related to dental care, and guarantees that families never wait longer than six weeks for dental appointments for their children.

What enrollment rules must I follow?

We would like you to choose a Primary Care Provider (PCP) for you and each member of your family when you enroll in Children's Community Health Plan. ach family member can have his or her own doctor. If you need help in choosing a PCP, you can call Customer Service at (800) 482-8010 (toll free). You can change doctors or clinics at any time by calling Customer Service at (800) 482-8010 (toll free). Women can see any Children's Community Health Plan OB/GYN without need for a referral.

Your PCP is responsible for coordinating all of your health care needs. Children's Community Health Plan will cover the care you receive from any of the providers within the Children's Community Health Plan network. Please see our Provider Directory for a complete list of the providers in our network, or visit our web site at www.childrenschp.com.
